The position in accordance with Section 28 subsection 3 of the Hamburg higher education act (Hamburgisches Hochschulgesetz, HmbHG) commences on as soon as possible.

This is a fixed-term contract in accordance with Section 2 of the academic fixed-term labor contract act (Wissenschaftszeitvertragsgesetz, WissZeitVG). The term is fixed until December 31, 2020. The position calls for 100 % of standard work hours per week**.

RESPONSIBILITIES:

Duties include academic services in the project named above. Research associates may also pursue independent research and further academic qualifications outside regular working hours.

SPECIFIC DUTIES:

The position is being filed as part of a ocean data activity conducted under the umbrella of the newly founded German Alliance for Marine Sciences. Duties of this position allocated at Universität Hamburg call for a secondary quality control of all hydrographic ocean data through data-data comparisons and model-data comparisons, their publication with DOI numbers, the control and possibly improvement of metadata and the publication in international portals.

REQUIREMENTS:

A university degree in a relevant field. MSc/diploma in the field of oceanography, geosciences or related disciplines.

* Full-time positions currently comprise 39 hours per week.
